Where ERCOT's market design has been, where it's headed, and what that means for the future of the grid. This session covers the fundamentals: the energy-only market, nodal pricing, and ancillary services and then connects them to the infrastructure race playing out right now, as a historic 200+ GW interconnection queue of large-load requests, driven largely by data centers and AI, tests how fast Texas can build. From RTC+B's launch to the new Batch Study process for large-load interconnection, panelists unpack how decisions made in the ERCOT stakeholder process shape which projects get built and previews what's likely headed for legislative debate as bills are filed in the coming weeks.
